

### Certificate Removal Procedure

1. Open an Internet Explorer browser. Click **Tools** → **Internet Options** → **Content**. Then click on **Certificates**.




2. Highlight the certificate you want to delete and click on **Remove**.



3. You might receive a warning asking “Do you want to delete the certificates?” Click **Yes**.



4. In order to verify that you have successfully deleted the digital certificate, Click **Tools** → **Internet Options** → **Content** → **Certificates** in Internet Explorer and verify that the certificate does not appear in the certificate store.



5. This completes the certificate removal procedure.
